Mental illnesses usually strike individuals in the prime of their lives, often during adolescence and young adulthood. All ages are susceptible, but the young are especially vulnerable. What often results are years of lost productivity, schooling, and employment. Seven to twelve million youth suffer from mental illness. Over 90% of teens who die by suicide suffer from mental illness. 2/3 of young people do not receive treatment. Suicide is the third leading cause of death in 15 - 19 year olds, following accidents and homicide. Males are at a much higher risk for suicide - one female dies for every four males.
