

Tom Suozzi for NY Governor, Reyna as Lieutenant

Common sense Democrats who get things done

MANHATTAN(New York): Congressman Thomas Suozzi popularly known as Tom Suozzi, a strong

Democratic candidate for New York Governor, accompanied by Diana Reyna, Deputy President of the Brooklyn Borough and candidate for Lieutenant Governor dur-

ing the forthcoming elections, addressed a large fund-raising gathering at a local hotel here the other day. Speaking on the occasion, Tom

Suozzi, a former Mayor of Glen Cove and a former Executive of the Nassau County, assured the audience that if elected, he would work hard for the betterment of the New Yorkers.

He said he would execute his 15-point crime intervention and protection plan which includes safety and police protection, an end to violence and the ever-increasing incidents of hate crimes and attacks at the MTA Subway stations.

Tom Suozzi expressed concern over the rising mental and health issues and assured to improve the health resources while he said to improve the education system he would implement his 'troubled schools transformation plan'.

He is a first generation American whose father migrated from Italy. A trained CPA and Attorney, a Congressman since 2016, recognized as 'Person of the Year' by the New York Immigration Coalition, named 'Environmentalist of the year' by the New York State League of Conservation Voters and 'F' rating from the NRA are his additional recogni-

tions. Diana Reyna, nominee for Lieutenant Governor, lauded the audience for their support to Tom

Suozzi, whom she knew from the last 20 years when he became the Mayor of Glen Cove, as a passionate, straightforward and hard-work-

ing person who protects workers' rights and wages, supports the police reforms and trusts in non-violence. She urged the New Yorkers

to elect Tom Suozzi as Governor and herself as Lieutenant Governor during the forthcoming primary elections.

Recalling her services as Council Woman for 12 years and later Deputy President of the Brooklyn Borough, under Eric Adams, she said she had served and worked for the people of the area and now she wants to serve under Tom Suozzi as Governor.

Reyna said Tom Suozzi and herself are common sense Democrats who get things done and common sense teaches us to learn, apply and share our experiences with others.
