June 21, 2007 - Internationally known Expressionist Artist and Sculptor Michelle Marie, whose work has been chosen to be displayed in the legendary windows of Tiffany's in New York City, for a three week run, from June 19th to July 10th, celebrated her latest accomplishment and the beginning of summer with a party at the exclusive Manhattan club Doubles.

Tiffany's Vice President, Creative Services, Robert Rufino, has chosen six paintings from the artists Faces & Flowers Collection. Each piece is a portrait of a different leading lady – for instance, Princess Isabella, Constantine, or Tatiana Rappoport. To compliment each painting a still life that reflects the subject's distinctly unique personality has been created. For example, Princess Isabella, who is quite an elegant lady with musings of Marie Antoinette, will enjoy having tea with the sterling silver Audubon tea set and Cirque Chinois teacups. As no girl is ever complete without her jewels, many distinct pieces will also be among the displays.

Michelle Marie has been described by Avenue Magazine as, "the Mary Cassatt or Georgia O'Keeffe of the 21st Century." Jean-Louis Gilliat, a Monégasque collector said, "The compelling intensity of Michelle Marie's figures makes an immediate, striking impression.
