Miami, FL. - April 13, 2007. Prominent artists Pervis Young, Tata Navia and Wanda Murphy joined together with Clare Vickery, owner of Grace Cafe & Gallery in Dana Beach, to celebrate a Miami institution, Shake-a-Leg Miami (SALM). The first of its kind, this fundraiser, “A Night Out in the South”, raised just under \$100,000 for the expansion of water sports and arts programs for underprivileged and handicapped children and adults. The dinner and art auction event, co-hosted by SALM founders, Harry Hogan and Dr. Barth Green, and the City of Miami Mayor Manny Diaz supported Shake-a-Leg’s Academy Center for Education and Vocational Training. The title sponsor was United Capital Asset Management and the evening included a variety of silent and live auction items, which raised funds for SALM.

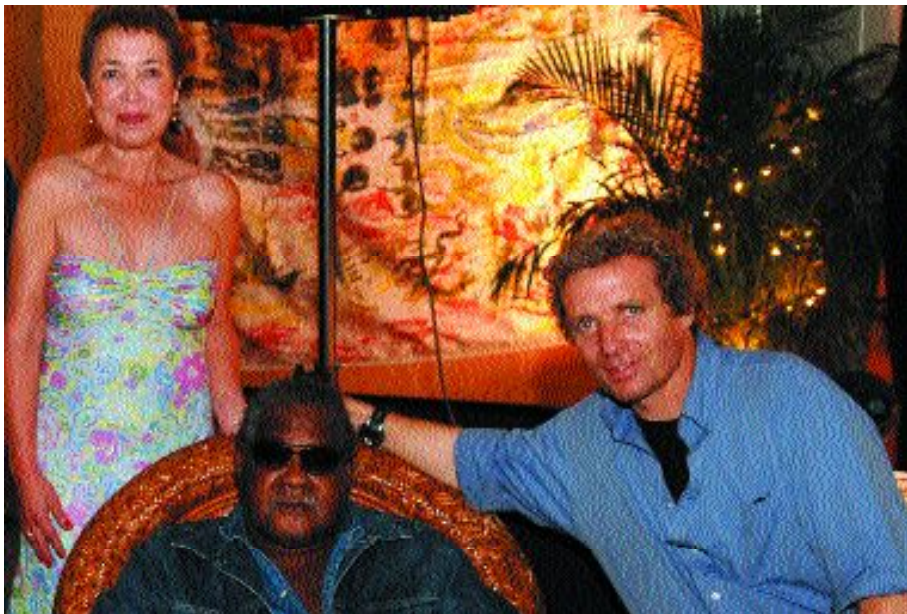
